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Introduction

Thank you for taking the time to go through this journey with me. Ever since I was a kid, I have been drawn to the God of the Bible. I was glued to the TV anytime a Bible movie came on (picture *The Ten Commandments* and any Jesus movie in the late '70s and early '80s). Over time I became familiar with certain people in the Bible like Noah, David, Daniel, or Moses, but I didn't understand where they were in history or that they were really one big family. After reading and studying over the last couple of decades, I finally have a fairly good foundation on the flow of the Bible and where the people fit.

The Bible does two things for me. It gives me my heritage and it teaches me how to live. The Bible is one of the main ways God communicates with me, reveals His character to me, and shows me His will for my life.

¹³ Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. ¹⁴ They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. ¹⁵ As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; ¹⁶ but they were kept from recognizing him.

¹⁷ He asked them, “What are you discussing together as you walk along?”

They stood still, their faces downcast. ¹⁸ One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, “Are you the only one visiting Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?”

¹⁹ “What things?” he asked.

“About Jesus of Nazareth,” they replied. “He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. ²⁰ The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; ²¹ but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place. ²² In addition, some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning ²³ but didn’t find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. ²⁴ Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see Jesus.”

²⁵ He said to them, “How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶ Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?” ²⁷ And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

²⁸ As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus continued on as if he were going farther. ²⁹ But they urged him strongly, “Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over.” So he went in to stay with them.

³⁰ When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. ³¹ Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. ³² They asked each other, “Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?”

³³ They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together ³⁴ and saying, “It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon.” ³⁵ Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.

Jesus told His disciples in Matthew 13:16-17 ¹⁶ “But blessed are your eyes, because they see; and your ears, because they hear. ¹⁷ For truly I say to you that many prophets and righteous men desired to see what you see, and did not see it, and to hear what you hear, and did not hear it.” Those in the Old Testament longed to see Jesus’ day. They had faith in His promise in the future just as we have faith in what He did in the past. They knew it was all about Him.

Before you begin studying or reading God's Word, consider praying these verses of scripture.

Open my eyes that I may see wonderful things in your law. Psalm 119:18

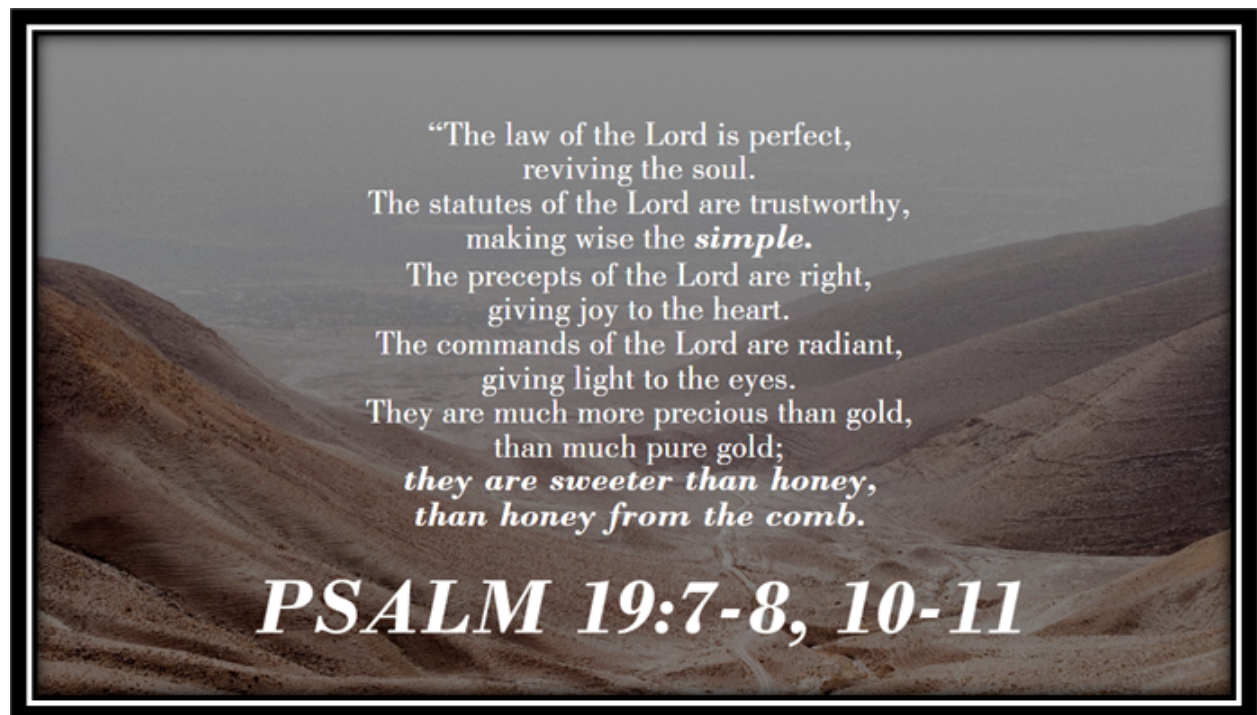
Then expect God to answer:

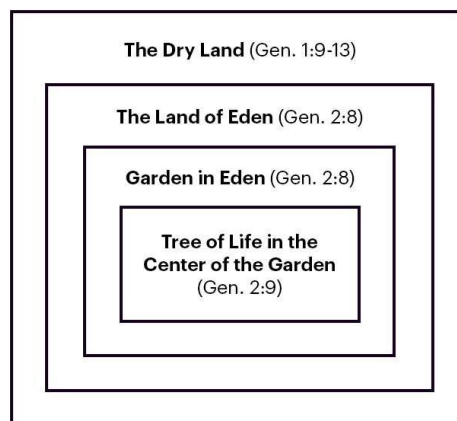

Seth... Enoch: Walking with God

Genesis 4:25-26, 5:1-5: Seth

Not much is said about Seth. He isn't mentioned anywhere except in the genealogies. We can know that he was not necessarily the third child born from Adam and Eve. He is just the third one mentioned because Scripture is focused on a certain lineage. Scripture says that Cain left with his wife to the land of Nod. Cain was also worried about others wanting to kill him. Those people had to come from somewhere. We know that Adam and Eve had more children (Genesis 5:3.4). We just don't know exactly how many and when. We also don't know how old Cain and Abel were when the murder happened. We can make assumptions based on the age of Adam and Eve when Seth was born.

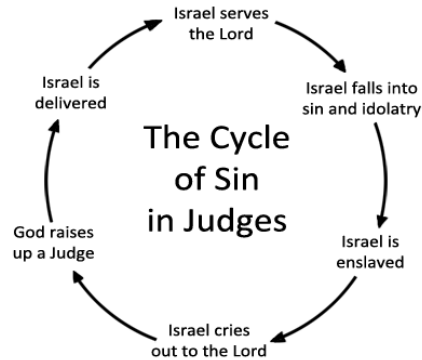
